



Prince Henry's Affiliates Scholarship

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

Founded in 1950 by Vivian Bullwinkel and Betty Jeffrey, outstanding nurses and survivors of WWII Prisoner-of-War camps, the Australian Nurses Memorial Centre (ANMC) was established to honour Australian nurses who served in the various theatres of wars or humanitarian operations. As part of its mission to act as "a living memorial" by advancing the nursing profession through education, the ANMC provides and administers scholarships for nurses and midwives undertaking postgraduate study at an Australian university or other accredited higher education institution.

Prince Henry's Hospital was a large general hospital located at 236 St Kilda Road, Melbourne. It was established in 1934 and provided acute-care services for communities in Melbourne and regional Victoria until its closure in 1991. The health and nursing services offered at Prince Henry's were transferred to the Monash Medical Centre and the Hospital buildings were demolished in 1994 to be replaced by commercial and residential developments.

An association of former staff, Prince Henry's Affiliates incorporating the Past Nurse Trainees Club, continued until 2008 when a fund was established to provide a scholarship to support study related to patient-centred, acute-care nursing. The scholarship was first awarded in 2013.

The Prince Henry's Affiliates Scholarship is now an annual award generously sponsored by Miss Marion Kilvert who trained and worked at Prince Henry's for many years. The scholarship is offered to remember Prince Henry's Hospital as a fine hospital and nurse training school that contributed significantly to health care in Victoria.

Study Subject: Related to patient-centred, acute-care nursing

Level: Postgraduate – Coursework or Research

Eligibility

This scholarship is for study in Australia. It is open to nurses who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia, hold current registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA), and are resident and practising in Victoria.

Payment Information

The scholarship is paid in two instalments (March and July) in the year of study. Research students are required to submit an Academic Progress Report demonstrating satisfactory academic progress in June and November. For recipients studying by course work a certified copy of the university transcript is required in July and December.
