ANMC & Australian Legion of Ex-Servicemen and Women Scholarship

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

The ANMC was founded in 1950 by Vivian Bullwinkel and Betty Jeffrey, outstanding nurses and survivors of WWII Prisoner-of-War Camps, the Australian Nurses Memorial Centre (ANMC) was established to honour Australian nurses who served in the various theatres of wars or humanitarian operations. As part of its mission to act as “a living memorial” by advancing the nursing profession through education, the ANMC provides and administers scholarships for nurses and midwives undertaking postgraduate study at an Australian university or other accredited higher education institution.

The ANMC & Australian Legion of Ex-Servicemen and Women Scholarship

The ANMC collaborates with the Australian Legion of Ex-Servicemen and Women (ALS) which sponsors scholarships for nurses undertaking postgraduate study involving care of the older person or palliative care. These Scholarships for one year of study at a recognised Australian university are available to nurses who are either current or ex-service personnel or a family member of a person who has served in the Australian Defence Force at any time. Priority will be given to nurses who are committed to working in a rural or regional area on completion of their study program.

Study Subject: Related to care of older persons or palliative care

Level: Postgraduate – Coursework or Research

Availability

The ALS Scholarships are offered annually to an unspecified number of applicants.

Eligibility

These scholarships are for study in Australia. They are open to nurses who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia; who hold current registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA); and who fulfil the requirement for connection to Australian Defence Force service. Please refer to Eligibility Criteria.

Payment Information

The value of these scholarships is up to AUD \$10,000 (maximum per award) paid in two instalments (March and June) in the year of study. Research students are required to submit an Academic Progress Report demonstrating satisfactory academic progress in mid May and mid November. For recipients studying by course work a certified copy of the University Transcript is required in July and December.

Application Details
